- Understand the different approaches to project management (predictive and agile)
- Initiate a project with a feasibility study
- Know how to estimate and anticipate risks upstream of project launch
- Plan your project using a project charter (including budget and tools)
- Define your position as project manager
- Manage project progress
- Communicate on your project

Teaching method

We offer a participative training approach that allows everyone to express and share their ideas. In this way, doctoral students can discuss their practices and find answers to their specific problems. Training is adapted to individual needs.

Programme

- Presentation of the different approaches to project management (agile and predictive), with summary and discussion. This presentation provides an overview of the different stages in project management and an understanding of the tools involved. Trainees are encouraged to choose a project (alone or in a group) as a case study to test the project management tools by phase.

- Motivation and group dynamics
- Managing and resolving complex problems (by testing CPS and co-development methods)
- Oral and written project communication exercises
